About Us:

Moonshot Centre, in Fordham Park, was constructed in 1981 in the wake of the New Cross fire that devastated so many lives in New Cross and beyond. Local people successfully lobbied for a building that would provide a base for the African and Caribbean communities of New Cross.

A consortium of four partners: IRIE Dance theatre, Playhouse Nursery, Deptford Green School, and the London Borough of Lewisham) oversaw the refurbishment of the building, which re-opened in 2007. IRIE Dance Theatre and the Playhouse Nursery remain resident organisations within the building, in addition to Double Jab. The primary aim of the consortium is to program activities within Moonshot Centre that benefit children and young people while also actively working to develop joint initiatives that draw on the skills and aspirations of all age groups.

Services and activities:

Current activities include: Capoeira, Dance Yourself Fit, Domino Club, Homework Club, IRIE young performers, and Pilates classes.

Facilities:

The building has rooms available for hire for a variety of uses. There are two Dance Studios, one larger than the other and one with raked seating. They are fully equipped with mirrors and ballet barres. The studios are regularly used for the practical classes of the dance Dance Foundation Degree program – a course that IRIE! dance theatre runs in partnership with City & Islington College and London Metropolitan University; the Laban Centre and Deptford Green School.

There are also two teaching rooms and a large Seminar Room that can be divided into three separate rooms. There's a cafe area and an atrium with raked seating overlooking Fordham Park.
